**LATE JOCKEY CHANGES:**

**Race 5 Inquiry/No Change**

Immediate following the running of the race the inquiry sign was hung to investigate the break, as several horses got away poorly. It was determined that #6 Veraaj had dropped its head down as the starter released the field which caused #6 Veraaj to stumble breaking outward and it was determined that she was afforded a fair start as the header turned loose of the horse and her doors opened on time with the rest of the field, and as such was declared a starter. While the #6 was scrambling to right herself from her awkward start the #5 Tiz Lucy who also broke awkwardly, came out to bump with the #7 Just Kathy, who then checked while in tight quarters. However the #7 beat the #5, and both riders made sufficient effort to straighten their mounts, and therefore no change was made to the order of finish.

**Race 9 Inquiry/Objection/No Change**

After the running of the race the stewards hung the inquiry sign followed by two jockey objections. Alex Cruz the rider of #8, Seattlesbestsecret, claimed an objection against #12 Top Executive ridden by Heribert Martinez for alleged interference at the head of the lane. Patrick Henry the rider of #3, Franks

Fix It, claimed an objection for alleged interference down the lane by the #5, Coastal Gasby, ridden by Javiar Matias. After review of the films and taking testimony from all the riders involve it was decided that there would be no change in the order of finish. The incident involving #12, Top Executive and #8, Seattlesbestsecret a slight infraction happened but it was #5, Coastal Jazz which #8, Seattlesbestsecret out ran. The other objection involving #3 Franks Fix It, ridden by Patrick Henry and #5 Coastal Jazz, ridden by Javiar Matias it was determined that the two year old's were running green but there was no contact between any of the contestants even though #3, Franks Fix It was in tight quarters.
